Parker University is a nonprofit, regionally accredited university that offers a Certificate in Massage Therapy (C-MT). The program prepares students to serve a wide variety of clients by using touch to manipulate the soft-tissue muscles of the body. Massage therapists are often multifaceted in their therapeutic techniques and able to help relieve pain, rehabilitate injuries, relieve stress, and jumpstart relaxation among clients.

#### PARKER'S MASSAGE THERAPY PROGRAM CONSISTS OF:

- Preparation for the Federation of State Massage Therapy Boards' MBLEx exam and Texas state licensure
- A total of 600 clock hours of hands-on training
  - 8 months/600-hour comprehensive program including advanced modalities: myofascial release, neuromuscular therapy and acupressure
  - 80 1-hour massages for clinical experience

- Demonstrate therapeutic and relaxation modalities of massage therapy in order to provide appropriate client care;
- Identify the relationships between the structure and function of the human body;

- Develop business goals and objectives for a career in the health and wellness industry;
- Determine the ability to incorporate basic massage technique knowledge with clinical application to provide high-quality evidence-based care.
