


Tyrannosaurus Rex



- A T-Rex would have been about 40 feet long, stood over 20 feet tall and weighed about 8 tons (that's 16,000 pounds!). Tyrannosaurus rex's arms were only about 3 feet long.
- He could chase his prey across an open field at speeds of 40 miles per hour.
- Four foot long jaws had 50 to 60 thick, bone-crunching teeth, which were over 9 inches long. That's about the size of a big banana.

Diplodocus



Wow! That's Long!

- 89 Feet long from head to tail the Diplodocus had a 20 foot long neck and a 45 foot long, whip like tail. They used their tail to fend off enemies.
- They weighed about 55,000 pounds.
- The Diplodocus was an Herbivore or a plant eater. They did not eat meat like the T-Rex.

Triceratops



- The name Triceratops means "Three horned Face". The horns above their eyes were as long as hockey sticks!
- They were 30 feet long, 10 feet tall and weighed about 6-12 tons - twice the size of a rhinoceros!
- They had no front teeth, so the front of their mouth looked like a turtle's beak. They had rows of scissor-like teeth in their cheeks. They were herbivores like the diplodocus.


