WHERE DO MASSAGE THERAPISTS WORK?

Massage therapists are often self-employed, with versatile work hours allowing for employment in both public and private settings. According to the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, America will see a 22% job growth of massage therapists through 2024—that's a projection of 205,200 jobs available. Employer-reported salary sources list the median salary for a massage therapist with an associate's degree in massage therapy as \$47,300. That's an 8.2% increase over a certificate of massage therapy.
