The Master of Public Health (MPH) program is designed for students who are ready to take the next step in making a difference in the health and well-being of their communities. Rooted in the core values of public health—prevention, community, and population-wide impact—the program prepares graduates to meet the evolving challenges of public health through a strong foundation in science, policy, and community engagement. THREE CONCENTRATIONS. THREE PATHWAYS TO LASTING IMPACT.

At Parker University, the MPH program offers three distinct concentrations that allow students to align their education with their professional goals and to meet needs within the public health landscape.

Epidemiology: For students driven by data, the Epidemiology concentration focuses on advanced quantitative methods and their application to public health research, policy development, and evidence-based program design. Learn to track disease patterns, evaluate health interventions, and shape healthcare policy.

Health Promotion: Become an agent of change within your community. With a focus on behavioral and social science, students will learn to design, implement, and evaluate programs. This concentration prepares you for work across public and private sectors championing community-based strategies.

Veterans Health: The first of its kind, the Veterans Health concentration prepares you to serve those who have served. Graduates are equipped to take on leadership roles addressing the complex and often underserved needs of the veteran population through targeted public health initiatives and policy innovation.
